KNOWLEDGE AND FAITH

These two states of mind are inversely related. The degree of measurable and testable observation with relevant contexts expresses knowledge. However, knowledge is never absolute. You may have mis-observed or mis-measured or the relevance of at least one context is suspect. You may still believe, but this belief is based not on knowledge but on faith. Faith takes over where knowledge fails. Also, the status of faith does not depend on your acknowledgement; you may still believe that knowledge names your relationship to any given reality, but any such belief is still based on faith.
